

Let Us Pray

It seems almost unfathomable that we can talk to the Creator of the universe. In Psalm 8, King David ponders this great mystery: "O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! You have set your glory above the heavens. Out of the mouth of babies and infants, you have established strength because of your foes, to still the enemy and the avenger. When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is man

that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him?" (Ps. 8:1-4)

Yet the Bible tells that that each of us actually is significant. That we are created in God's image, that He loves us, and that He created us to be in a relationship with Him. And this relationship is an intimate one. Truth be told, we need to be trained to overcome our innate belief that God neither hears us, nor will answer when we pray. Because this is true, one old Christian prayer begins like this: "Almighty and everlasting God, you are always more ready to hear than we to pray, and to give more than we either desire or deserve..."

The reason that we can have confidence that God both hears and answers our prayers is because He has reconciled Himself to us in Christ Jesus (2 Cor. 5:18-19). Where our sin separated us from Him, God has provided the remedy through Jesus' work of redemption on the cross so that, "to all who did receive [Jesus], who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God..." (John 1:12)

Your gracious Heavenly Father wants you to pray to Him in all circumstances. Approach Him with your worries, fears, doubts, complaints, thanksgiving, and praise. The Apostle Paul puts it so wonderfully in 1 Thessalonians 5:17-18: "pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." So regardless of whether things are going well or poorly for us, let us pray.
